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FOLLOWING UP ON THE WAYWARD

Reasons are few—excuses are many. You've heard them all or think you have, until the next one comes along! The weather - "it's too hot"—or maybe "it's too cool." The message—is "not short enough"—but sometimes "it's too long!" "Johnny's got a headcold" and the rest of the family stays home to blow that poor kid's nose! But possibly—the kids and their families are not the only ones making the excuses. It's work to get them back again. And sometimes we just don't get around to it—and for lack of effort the child is lost.

How do we woo them back? First—make a time each week when you look at the roll and check out who has been missing and pray about them. Ask the Lord for help in saying and doing the very thing that might win them all over again. Then grab up a few little things that will remind them that you care and go after them. You may not always be able to visit the home—though personal contact is preferred. If not, use the phone and let your fingers do the walking.

Call them by name. Every one likes to hear their own name. If a parent answers, make sure you know their names too and tell them your purpose and remind them who you are and why you're calling. Tell them of any upcoming events and don't count on verbal messages being passed on by the children.

Be gentle and patient in your approach, but make clear your desire to see them and when you do—tell them how much it means to you that they have come along. Just a few kind words could win the battle.

Perhaps a sickness or tragedy has intervened that you were unaware of. Express your interest and assure them of your prayers—even ask if they would appreciate you sharing the burden with others who share your interest in prayer for the class. If such has taken place or is ongoing— send a card and make sure you follow up with a visit. Your interest may well put the parents / guardians squarely on your side.

A move may be coming up—a number of reasons exist for that today. Families move more frequently than they used to. More families are splitting - that child in your care may need help now more than ever. If you can, see to it that they transfer to another Sunday School if they move at a distance. They could then be approached from that SS with a small housewarming gift and a welcoming, interested & friendly invitation.

Some of those who are missing may be those who have previously professed. Possibly, they've been discouraged or hurt even by our own. This world system is calculated to and cruel. Don't allow them to go without a fight! Don't let them be swept away. Tenderly bring Christ before them. Seek to leave tiny heart-warming nuggets of truth & encouragement with them. Remember who they belong to.... and do it for HIM.
